

## Quarter Scale Garden Bench

### SUPPLIES NEEDED

- Fine Sandpaper
- Paint or Stain
- Small Paint Brush
- Wood Glue
- Tweezers
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Mat knife and/or small handsaw

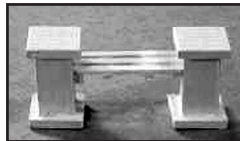
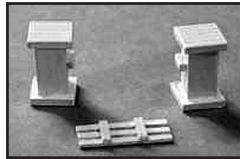
### OPTIONAL

- Miter Box
- Chopper II cutter

### WOOD PIECES REQUIRED

- 1/4" x 1/4" x 7/16" Cut 2 (Pillars)
- 1/16" x 3/8" x 3/8" Cut 4 (Pillar Tops/Bottoms)
- 1/16" x 1/16" x 3/16" Cut 2 (Pillar Seat Braces)
- 1/32" x 1/32" x 3/4" Cut 3 (Seat Strips)
- 1/32" x 1/32" x 5/16" Cut 2 (Seat Braces)

1. LIGHTLY sand all pieces. Make sure ends of each 1/4" square pillar piece are as flat as possible.
2. Paint or stain all pieces. Allow to dry.
3. Center and glue the 3/8" x 3/8" x 1/16" pieces to tops and bottoms of each 1/4" x 1/4" x 7/16" pillar.
4. Glue one 1/16" x 1/16" x 3/16" pillar seat brace to 'inside' of one pillar (see photo), approximately 1/4" up from base piece. Repeat for second pillar. (Seat will be glued to and rest on these pieces.)
5. Using tweezers, build your seat by centering and gluing



the 2 short seat braces across the bottom of the 3 seat strips (see photo).

6. Glue seat between pillars and resting on pillar seat braces.
7. You're finished!

Optional: Drill a hole in top of pillars large enough to hold a clay pot filled with a plant.

Or - Accessorize with flowerpot, hat, book or "whatever".
