

## Fringed Flowers



### TOOLS

- Scissors
- Tacky Glue
- Metal Ruler
- Wire Cutters

### MATERIALS

- Wooden flower pot (you can get them at Hobby Lobby or Michaels)
- Terra Cotta paint or color of your choice (for your pot)
- 1/8" wide quilling paper or construction paper (color of your choice) If you want bigger flowers you will need wider and longer strips of paper.
- Thin green wire
- Air fern or other greenery

Fringe strips of colored paper (as shown) by making cuts along one edge to center of strip. The finer the fringe the more delicate the flower will be. The easiest way is to fringe a long strip and then cut it into the size you need for each flower.

You will need:

- 1 strip, 1" long
- 2 strips, 1-1/2" long
- 1 strip, 2" long



Fringe

Glue a 1" piece of wire to one end of the fringed paper, fringed edge facing up, and let dry. When dry, wrap entire fringe strip tightly around wire, applying dots of glue as you go to hold bottom and end of fringe tight; DON'T get glue on fringe. Hold in place until dry.



Rolled Fringe

Hold base of flower with fingernail of one hand, and separate and spread fringe outward with fingernail of other hand. When you have finished all four flowers cut the wire so you can arrange them in your pot to suit you.



Spread Fringe

Glue flowers in the pot and add some air fern or other greenery if desired.
