## Man's Folded Shirt

C ut fabric according to layout. Spread tacky glue over entire collar and cuff. Fold half lengthwise and press together firmly. Set aside.

Spread small amount of glue on both long edges of sleeve. Fold toward middle—wrong side—to form sleeve. Let dry.

Put small amount of glue on small card. Glue this to wrong side of fabric marked shirt. Do not center, but place it toward the left so when the left side is folded over, the edge will be center front. Fold excess top and bottom and glue to back. Trim if necessary.

Take the sleeve and place it in back of top left side at an angle (wrong side toward shirt) so the sleeve will angle down to lower right. Fold toward front and trim so the finished sleeve is to right of center front.

Trim the collar and cuff section to about 3/16". Cut a piece to fit sleeve about 1" and glue around sleeve edge. The remaining piece will form your collar. Fold to look like a collar. Put small amount of glue on top of shirt and attach. When dry, put a small amount of glue at top edge of front collar and attach these edges to shirt.

Put one button at top edge of collar and space the others down the front. If you like, you can put two buttons down collar. Add one in center of cuff.

Our Basement Friends added the shirt box (CUT FROM CARD STOCK) and put tissue in the box. They also added a bow tie and cummerbund to the shirt for a dressier presentation.
