

## One Inch Scale Flower Fairy



### Materials:

6" Acton Figure Body (Amazon: [Amazon.com: 1/12 Scale Female Body, 6inch Female Joint Flexible Action Figure Body with Head Sculpt&Stand Collection \(Pale Skin, Little Bust\) : Toys & Games](#))

Fairy Wigs (Etsy: [Fae Wings Digital Download Collage Sheet PDF Faerie Fairy fairy Crown - Etsy](#))

Sharp scissors

Fake cloth flower(s) large roses or peonies work well

Beacon Fabritac or Beacon 3-in1 clear instant glue

Paint for hair – brown, yellow or copper

Fine tweezers

Black acrylic paint or fine line sharpie

White and choice of brown or blue acrylic paint for eyes

Fine point brush

Toothpick

Optional - embellishments such as holeless beads, silk ribbon or glitter

Directions:

1. Assemble action figure by firmly pushing head, and choice of hands and feet onto mannequin.
2. Paint eyes and hair with acrylic paint. (If you are not comfortable painting your fairy's head, a pre-painted head is available on Amazon: ([Amazon.com: RootWorld 1/12 Scale Female Head Sculpt, Europen Beauty Planted Hair Head Carved Carving for 6 inches Phicen TBLeague Action Figure Body : Toys & Games](https://www.amazon.com/Amazon.com-RootWorld-1-12-Scale-Female-Head-Sculpt-Europen-Beauty-Planted-Hair-Head-Carved-Carving-for-6-inches-Phicen-TBLeague-Action-Figure-Body-Toys-amp-Games)))
3. Cut 3 blossoms from flower.
4. Cut one blossom into three petals
5. Glue one petal to chest of fairy for a bodice and glue two petal section to the hips of the fairy to make her underwear.
6. Add a skirt of two or more blossoms at the fairy's waist and glue with glue underneath flower.
7. Trim wings from acetate sheet and add to the fairy's back by gluing under the petals on her shoulders.
8. Finish your fairy by gluing a blossom upside down on her head and embellishing the hole in the center of the blossom with a holeless bead, tiny bow or glitter.
9. Optional – you can also add glitter shoes, paint colored wings and add accessories to your heart's desire.

This fairy was inspired by the work of Cicely Mary Barker, author of many beautifully illustrated Flower Fairy Books from the 1920's.
